Difficulties paying insurance due to COVID-19

You may be eligible for reduction or exemption of various insurance premiums for fiscal year 2022. In addition to those listed below, there are other conditions that must be met in order to be eligible for this service.

Eligible households

- (1) Households in which the main financial provider has died or been seriously injured due to COVID-19.
- (2) Households whose main financial provider's income has decreased by 30% or more from 2021 due to COVID-19.

Basics of Cancer Prevention "Stopping Lifestyle-related Diseases"

While regular cancer screenings are important to reduce cancer death rates, it is equally important to develop lifestyle habits that prevent cancer. According to the National Cancer Institute, practicing five healthy habits can almost halve your risk of getting cancer.

Quitting Smoking

It is harmful not only to the smoker but also to the health of those around them. Medical insurance may cover the cost of medical treatment. For a list of medical institutions in the prefecture that accept insurance for smoking cessation therapy, scan the QR code on the right.

Moderation in Drinking

Approximate amount of alcohol to be consumed: 180 ml of sake; large beer bottle (633 ml); 1 bottle of shochu or awamori; 120ml of undiluted Shochu or Awamori; 1 double glass of whiskey; about 1/3 of a bottle of wine.

Revising Eating Habits

The goal for vegetable intake is 350g/day. Wakayama citizens tend to lack one serving (about 70g). Let's cook more vegetables!

Exercise

60 minutes of walking, or more strenuous physical activity per day, plus 60 minutes of exercise per week that increases respiration and perspiration rate.

Maintaining Healthy Body Weight

Manage your weight so that your BMI is in the range of 21-27 for men and 21-25 for women! BMI = (weight in kg) / (height in m x height in m)

Let's try to make stress-free health improvements
