### Preventing Heat Stroke Contact: Regional Health Division \$\mathbb{A}88 \cdot 5119

Heat stroke refers to an illness that arises in high temperature environments, when one's bodily water/sodium levels become imbalanced, and regulatory functions fail. The elderly and babies are more prone to heat stroke than adults, so caution is required.

#### The following groups should exercise extra caution!

- · Elderly people are more insensitive to heat, and their bodily heat regulatory functions are deteriorating.
- · Babies (heat regulatory functions are undeveloped); and those with sleep deficit, low energy, or a poor physical condition.
- · Those who do not like the cold, and do not use air conditioning or fans must exercise caution in their homes

Exercise caution if you exhibit such symptoms as headaches, dizziness, nausea, or cramping.



#### Tips for preventing heat stroke

- Frequently hydrate even if you do not feel thirsty. Drink 1-2 cups of water before working out.
- · Wear breezy clothes of good quality, or choose clothes of thin fabric and a colour that does not easily absorb
- Adjust the heat and humidity of your house.

(Use the air conditioner and fan if the room temperature is above 28° C and 60% humidity)

#### Provision of heatstroke resting facilities

From Jun 1 (Thurs)–Sep 29 (Fri), heatstroke resting facilities will be provided in 56 locations across the city, including city hall satellite offices and community centers (only available during operation hours). If your condition worsens while you are outside, please stop at a resting facility.
