# Let's Aim for a City that's Easy to Live In!

Every year, 'Disability Week' is held from 12/3 to 12/9. This period is used to both further understanding and appreciation of social services for disabilities, and to give those with disabilities motivation to proactively participate in various activities, such as social, economic, and cultural ventures.

## Disability Symbols —

Let's understand their meaning and give the necessary considerations to those with them.

# International Symbol for those with Disabilities



An internationallyrecognized symbol to clearly denote buildings and institutions that any people with disabilities are able to use.

#### International Symbol for the Blind



An internationallyrecognized symbol for those with a visual impairment. Make sure to not put things on top of Braille blocks or to park cars, bicycles, etc. in these areas.

#### **Physical Disability Symbol**



Denotes a driver with a physical impairment. Be careful to not unnecessarily crowd or to cut in front of them.

\*There is a possibility of punishment for these actions according to traffic regulations.

#### **Help Symbol**



Symbol to indicate those who need assistance or consideration and is not limited to only disabilities (those with artificial limbs, an internal disability, in early stages of pregnancy, etc.).

#### White Cane SOS Signal: Symbol for Public Awareness



Raising a white cane 50cm above one's head is an SOS signal. Approach, call out, and give assistance.

### **Hearing Impaired Symbol**



Denotes a driver with a hearing impairment. Be careful to not unnecessarily crowd or to cut in front of them.

\*There is a possibility of punishment for these actions according to traffic regulations.

#### **Heart Plus Symbol**



For those with an internal impairment that is difficult to notice from their outward appearance. Let's be understanding of these individuals too.

#### Ostomate Equipment/Ostomate



Indicates that there are facilities (mainly for the cleaning of equipment, etc.) for those with a colostomy or artificial bladder (ostomate).

#### Service Dog Symbol



A symbol for awareness of a Service Dog for the Disabled (guide dog for the blind, deaf, or for general assistance). 

Service dogs are trained. We appreciate your cooperation in letting those with disabilities use facilities along with their service dog.

#### Ear Symbol



Indicates a hearing disability. Either communicate via sign language, writing, or face them directly and speak slowly and clearly.

# Symbol for Employment Support for those with Disabilities



A symbol given to corporations or organizations that are recognized as providing support for at home or in-person employment.

- ②Separate household, small electric appliances, cans, bottles, cloth, paper, PET bottles, glass, and ceramic waste before taking them to the facility.
- ③Bring identification for both the owner of the waste and its transporter, as well as proof of the waste's origin.

# **Fire Prevention Tips** for Winter

When the weather gets colder, fire is used more often. Let's check where sources of fires are in our daily lives.



## Don't Smoke While Lying Down!

- · Don't smoke or let others smoke while lying down.
- · Don't leave lit cigarettes in the ash tray.





## Pay Close Attention While Using!

- · Heaters are prone to fires, so use it away from other things.
- When refueling, always turn off the heat and check the type of fuel.
- · Do not leave spray cans near heaters or where they are in contact with hot air.



## Don't Forget Behind Furniture!

- Clean the dust off of outlets regularly.
- · Unplug plugs that are not in use.





#### Don't Leave Unattended!

- · Don't leave stoves unattended while in
- · Clean the inside of grills after using.
- · Use stoves with built-in safety functions.



#### Don't Use if Abnormal!

- · Stop using lithium ion batteries if they expand, make strange noises, smell strange, or give off heat.
- Do not dispose of them in the household garbage- take them to a participating recycle shop's collection box or dispose of them during the small electrical appliance pick-up that occurs twice a year.

# **Preventing Food Poisoning From Norovirus**

Food poisoning from Norovirus is particularly prevalent during winter. Let's learn about its characteristics and how to prevent it to work on stopping its spread.

#### ▼ Characteristics

The period from infection to the appearance of symptoms (incubation period) is 24-48 hours. Nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, etc. are its main symptoms. Under normal circumstances, recovery takes a few days.

#### ▼Preventative Steps

- Wash hands thoroughly
- For foods that must be heated, make sure to heat them all the way through
- Make sure to clean cookware clean, disinfecting with a chlorine-based bleach cleaner and hot water
